


















# How do IOPs support the implementation of the Convention?

- Promoting synergies and building links with other processes
- Enabling and supporting action to include wetlands into relevant national strategies and plans e.g. NBSAPs, NDCs, Sustainable Development Plans
- Strengthening the **designation**, **conservation** and **management** of Wetlands of International Importance
- Supporting the development and implementation of Resolutions and delivery of the Convention's Strategic Plan
- Contribute to **STRP** and **CEPA** activities
- Regional and national level **capacity building**


