# World Wetlands Day, February 2, 2006 Final Report

The Jamaica Environment Trust (JET) celebrated World Wetlands Day on February 2, 2006 by educating students across the island about the importance of wetlands. Information packages on wetlands were sent to all 353 schools in JET's Schools' Environment Programme (SEP). The packages included information on the functions and value of wetlands, a list of Jamaica's Ramsar sites, and suggested activities for the students to celebrate World Wetlands Day. Participating schools faxed a list of their activities to JET.

Students took tours of wetlands, mounted wetland exhibitions, and conducted research on wetland plants and animals. Students from Cedar Valley Primary and Junior High in St. Thomas went bird watching by the Yallahs Pond, St. Thomas, and SEP schools in St. Elizabeth and Westmoreland participated in wetland competitions organized by JET's NGO partners, the Malvern Science Resource Centre in St. Elizabeth and Negril Area Environmental Protection Trust in Westmoreland respectively. Over 50 schools participated and many did more than one activity. (See Appendices 1 & 2)

JET also participated in World Wetland Day activities on February 2<sup>nd</sup> at the Port Royal Maine Lab. These were organized by the National Environment and Planning Agency (NEPA), Secretariat for the Ramsar Committee in Jamaica. The activities included an Opening Ceremony, a dramatic presentation on wetlands by Vauxhall Comprehensive High School, PowerPoint presentations on wetlands by JET, aquarium displays of mangrove roots set up by the Port Royal Marine Lab and a boat tour of the Palisadoes/Port Royal wetland, guided by staff of the Port Royal Marine Lab and NEPA.

JET gave a PowerPoint presentation entitled "Wetland Wonders" and distributed handouts on how to protect mangrove forests, copies of JET's *Earth Facts* publication on wetlands and posters on sea birds donated by the West Indian Whistling Duck and Wetlands project. The younger children were given copies of the *West Indian Whistling Duck Colouring Book*.

### Highlights of the activities at Port Royal Marine Lab

Ms. Judith Maloney, the Principal Director in the Ministry of Land and Environment announced that Portland Bight was designated Jamaica's third Ramsar site, joining the other two: Black River Lower Morass (1998) and Palisadoes and Port Royal Cays (2005). Dr. Dale Webber, Chair of the Ramsar Committee was presented with a plaque in recognition of his contribution.

Aquarium displays of wetland plants and animals were set up for the students to view. These included mangrove prop roots, sponges, bivalves, sea squirts, anemones, starfish, jellyfish and juvenile fish.

On the boat tour, the students were able to see these animals in their natural habitat, as well as some of the threats facing the mangroves. These threats included hurricanes that had destroyed some of the mangrove trees, bags of garbage illegally dumped in the wetland and the effect of predation by rats and mongoose on the bird populations. The latter was evident by the

significantly higher number of birds nesting on the cays than on the coast.

### **Participants**

Approximately 100 students from eight corporate area schools attended the activities at Port Royal Marine Lab. Three schools, Vauxhall Comprehensive High School, Immaculate Conception High School and Holy Childhood Prep are SEP schools. The other five are Camperdown High School, Campion College, Wolmer's High School for Girls, Wolmer's Prep and Port Royal All Age.

Also in attendance were Ms. Judith Maloney Principal Director in the Ministry of Land and Environment, Mrs. Joy Alexander, Acting CEO of NEPA, and Professor Emeritus Ivan Goodbody of the University of the West Indies, after whom the Goodbody Channel in Port Royal was named.

# Media coverage

Coverage for JET's activities was generated on four radio stations and in two national newspapers. Pre event coverage was generated on "Disclosure" Hot 102, *The Gleaner* and *Children's Own*. Post event coverage was generated on "Science in Action", JIS Radio, "Laing and Company", Power 106 and "Breakfast Club", Power 106. The JIS Radio programme "Science in Action" was aired on KLAS FM 89, Hot 102, Power 106, RJR 94 FM and twice on Roots FM 96.1.
